

Dear Commissioners:

Thank you for your service on the 2012 Senate Apportionment Commission. It is an important, albeit thankless, responsibility. All of us appreciate you devoting the considerable time necessary to complete your work.

I know you have many factors to consider as you determine the senatorial districts and I trust your judgment. Having said that, I wanted to provide this input:

On behalf of Missouri State University, I would respectfully request that you maintain the City of Springfield as one separate senatorial district.

There are three major reasons for this request:

1. Missouri State University has pieces of its campus in several parts of the city, including the main campus at National and Grand, the Downtown Campus that spreads over several city blocks, and the Darr Agricultural Center in west Springfield. It is helpful to work with one Senator on all aspects of the campus, especially since our assets are split among several state Representative districts.
2. Missouri State works closely with many partners in Springfield: Chamber, City, Public Schools, Ozarks Technical College, etc. This kind of cooperation is essential and, frankly, there are challenges enough working with multiple organizations without interjecting a split senatorial district into the mix.
3. Finally, when constituent issues arise in Springfield that effect Missouri State, it has been helpful to have one Senator to work with to resolve them. It helps with context, consistency, and communication.







To: The Senate Apportionment Commission

It has come to my attention that the latest map, drawn to redistrict the state of Missouri, is moving Senate District 7 from Chesterfield/St Louis County to the Kansas City area. District 7, which is up for reelection in 2012, is "replacing" a senate district in Kansas City that was NOT up for reelection this year; additionally, the new KC district voters are predominately Democratic vs. the Chesterfield district's historically Republican voters. It appears that (at least) some on the Commission are hoping to produce an outcome that will favor Democrats in the upcoming state and national elections, as well as provide an additional Democratic senator for the next two sessions in the Missouri legislature. All these actions will produce outcomes that are inconsistent with voters' wishes, as reflected in the past election results.

I do not believe that the move of District 7 is right and I'm concerned that my views and preferences on the upcoming elections (both state and general) are being compromised. The move of District 7 to Kansas City provides an advantage to the Democratic vote in upcoming elections and the Commission recommendation is at odds with the historical and current wishes of District 7 voters. Further, it makes no sense when you consider that both the House and Senate are controlled by the Republican party. The voters in District 7 expect and deserve to be represented by the representatives they have voted into office over the last decade.

The proposed redistricting is not only unfavorable for voters in District 7, but it also could have a negative impact on the people of St Louis. The move of District 7 to KC results in St Louis City and County losing a Senate district; that outcome could very well produce an imbalance in the present 4-4 (Republican - Democratic) senate representation that we have today. After relocating Dist 7 to KC, if the City's/County's representation moves to 3-4, 2-5 or 1-6 then St Louis we will be depending on a minority to represent us - - - again, this is at a time when Republicans control both houses of the legislature. As I understand the proposed changes the probability that this redistricting could produce a 1-6 (Rep to Dem) outcome is much greater than ever because the movement of population within the districts has been designed to support one Republican senator rather than the current four.

I urge you to vote NO on this latest redistricting map and instead adopt the second Judicial Commission map that was originally thrown out on a technicality. Conservatives in Missouri played a significant part in growing the Republican party in our state and voting in the current leadership. Please stand up for our best interests and establish a position that is consistent with the wishes of those who elected you as their representatives.


