DEFINITION	
<i>Name</i>	Agency Portal
<i>Description</i>	Missouri government is comprised of multiple agencies each providing specific information, products and services. An agency portal is an entry point to the news, services, and information for that agency. Agency portals should include a search engine to narrow the focus of locating products, services, and information. Appropriate reciprocal hyperlinks should point to the Missouri portal when multiple agencies provide joint services.
<i>Rationale</i>	Customers should not need to know the organizational structure of an agency to find a specific piece of information or service. The agency portal should be broad enough to capture or umbrella the various services available and act as a pointer to them. It should display the aesthetic elements of the site branding.
<i>Benefits</i>	This emphasis aids the customer in finding information, news and/or service without knowing the organizational structure.

COMPLIANCE DETAIL	
<i>State the Guideline, Standard or Legislation</i>	<p>The agency portal should reflect relevant content that is organized in an easy-to-find manner. It must be current and timely which necessitates a periodic review of content and/or hyperlinks. Outdated material should be purged.</p> <p>The agency portal should provide a summary of the services that the agency is responsible for administering. In addition to its specific programs or services, any joint services with other agencies should be made available on the Missouri portal and linked from the agency portal. A common launching point is the goal of reciprocal services or information.</p> <p>Implementation of a method to narrow a search is desired. The availability of offering a search collection of indexed information specific to a program or service is recommended in addition to using the broader search collection containing agency-wide information.</p>
