history:

Established in 1833, the Jefferson City Correctional Center is the oldest continuously operated institution west of the Mississippi. Starting with its first inmates in 1836, the Correctional Center housed nearly 4,500 inmates. Now home to over 2000 inmates, the facility has held some of the region's most famous criminals, including James Earl Ray, the accused assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The institution is distinguished by a limestone wall with 15 officer towers surrounding a 47-acre compound. Within the walls you'll find factories, warehouses, administrative offices, recreational facilities, food services buildings, utility/services tunnels, and eight housing units.

the Challenge:

Architects, planners, engineers, real estate professionals, and others with creative imaginations have the chance to explore the exciting possibilities offered by this unique site as it relates to the community and its environment. Those participating in this unique mixed use urban design challenge will experience a rewarding, thought provoking weekend of evaluation, debate, and recommendation of possible solutions to land use. Watch for future communication, which will clarify location, date, and participant parameters.

Acting on the request of the Missouri Division of Design and Construction, AIA Missouri is sponsoring a Professional Charrette to explore the redevelopment of the historic Jefferson City Correction Center District. Architects, planners, engineers, developers, and real estate specialist are invited to form teams to participate in this 2-1/2 day event. Participants lodging and meals will be provided. In creating shared visions they will contribute to a successful future for one of Missouri's most historic sites.
