# history:

Established in1833, the Jefferson City Correctional Center is the oldest continuously operated institution west of the Mississippi. Starting with it's first inmates in 1836, the Correctional Center housed nearly 4,500 inmates. Now home to over 2000 inmates, the facility has held some of the region's most famous criminals, including James Earl Ray, the accused assassin of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. The institution is distinguished by a limestone wall with 15 officer towers surrounding a 47-acre compound. Within the walls you'll find factories, warehouses, administrative offices, recreational facilities, food services buildings, utility/services tunnels, and eight housing units.
